## **Principals' Report** Ms Kline outlined the three priorities for this academic school year: 1: Mental Health of our community 2: Academic Excellency - we received the platinum ECO award Claudia Kline 3. Relationships with the Faith Community – its Catholic dimension and it inclusive value We have 550 students registered at this time. We are facing a declining enrollment concern. We will have an OPEN House program on Oct 26 to highlight our school, its programs and opportunities. There will be a number of workshops and course presentations Twenty six clubs will be highlighted. We will have our choir and band performing. There will be school tours hosted by our students. Parent Interview Night Nov 9th Dec 1st School Blessing of our new (10 million) extension and our altar. Bishop Camilleri, our Regional Bishop has been invited for the blessings with Father Joseph Our Awards Ceremony will take place in December Question: If a student won an award from another school; how will the student receive the award? In reference to Notre Dame. Mr Scanga was willing to investigate and get back to the parent Our cafeteria will receive a projection unit. Approximate cost \$30,000 Our cafeteria service will be opened at the end of October. The company is having a problem to hire a staff. Busing continues to be a challenge for our students. Due to limited bus drivers Attridge had to combine two bus routes as a result students are faced with a long period of time on the bus. There are no late buses for our students. Parents need to transport their daughters after school programs. **New BUSINESS** Ms Kline outlined two proposals for parental input. Proposal 1: Change of School schedule for next September 2023 for ONLY Grade 9 students Proposal to de-semester the Mathematics and English courses.

	The student will take these two courses for the entire year on a daily rotation Day 1 & Day 2 Rationale: Our grade 9 students are faced with a challenge of retention learning in Mathematics and English in a semester schedule. A student might be scheduled for this course over a possible 12 month period. This approach will assist our students to achieve a more comprehensive learning schedule  Many parents supported this proposal as their daughters have had to face many learning barriers and challenges with the present timetable. All parents supported this proposal  Proposal 2:  Ms Kline proposed that our graduation June ceremony be returned to our school gym.  Rational: Our 2022 Graduation ceremony costed the school \$15000. The banquet halls are now charging \$9,000 to \$10,000 for a three hour period for the room and chairs and additional costs for lighting and sound systems.  Returning to the school would mean that we could increase the number of guests for each student and a reception in our cafeteria. Our parking could be handled with our parking lot and the Recreational Centre and St Jude Church.  It was recommended that we could purchase some drapes to cover some of our gym walls. We also have an excellent sound and lighting systems. This proposal would the school and the graduates a significant amount of money.  Many parent supported this proposal. The proposal was endorsed by the parents and the school council.
